
6:45 pm providing an oasis of peace each week.

The Greens at Redmond will be hosting our event at their wonderful 18-hole mid-iron course. This facility is one of the best mid-iron courses in the Pacific Northwest. Head Pro Craig Mellott has given us a great rate and promises wonderful weather! This event is open to all members and friends of our church, and you are invited to bring a friend along as well!

The cost is \$50 per player. A cart is included in the price, but you may choose to walk. This includes 18 holes of golf, dinner and prizes.



Prizes will be given for closest to the pin, long drive, low three team scores, and 3 places in the putting contest.

Teams will be formed from all entrants using an ABCD pairing.

Each person will need to declare their approximate level of play when they sign up as follows:

- A – a player with a normal round under 95 and who plays once a week or more
- B – a player with a normal round over 95 and who plays once a week or more
- C – a player who plays occasionally but can break 120 sometimes
- D – a player who seldom plays and rarely breaks 120



Each team will play a scramble format. Each person will hit a ball off the tee; then the team will select the best shot, and each team member will play the next shot from that location. This will be repeated until the ball is in the hole.

Teams will be assigned tee times starting at 1:30 p.m. and going off about every 7.5 minutes after that.

A nine-hole putting contest will be held after the golf rounds.

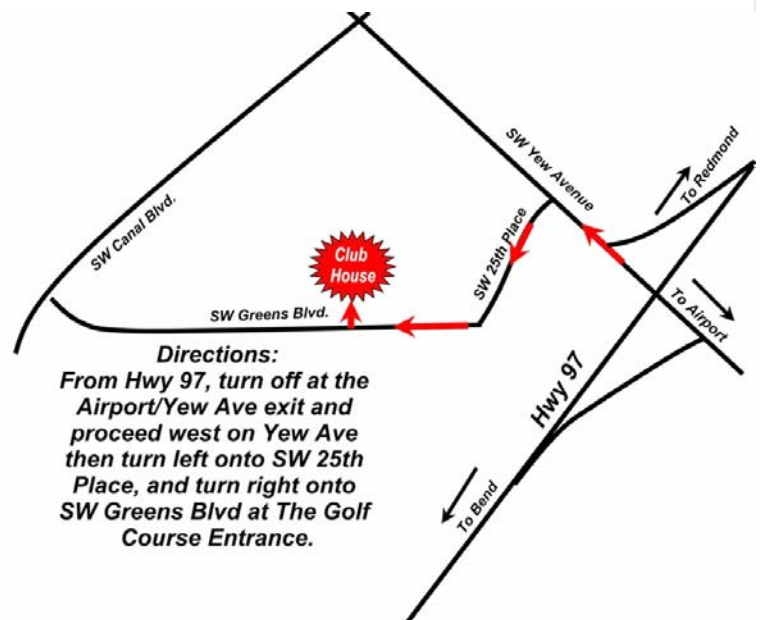
Dinner will be provided by the club after the putting contest finals, with an option for a hamburger or pulled pork with side salads and drinks.

## Session Highlights

At its August 18 meeting, Session:

- Ordained and installed Tim Conlon and Sue Nell Phillips as ruling elders and installed LeBron Hardie as a ruling elder.
- Endorsed the change from Wednesday night to Sunday night youth group meetings with a new worship service (The “5:01”) and light soup and salad meal between the two youth meetings. The new schedule will begin Sunday, October 4.
- Discussed the upcoming stewardship campaign and chose “Hope Rising!” as the theme for this year’s campaign. Last year’s theme was “Planting Seeds of Hope.” Session will be in charge of the campaign, and it will begin October 11 and conclude on Sunday, November 15, Commitment/Celebration Sunday.
- Heard a report on the June 26-27 meeting of the Presbytery of the Cascades, which was held at Columbia Presbyterian Church in Vancouver, Washington. At that meeting Presbytery approved the Church Information Form for The Trailhead New Church Development sponsored by FPC Bend and empowered the New Church Development Team to form a PNC for the purpose of calling an Organizing Pastor.
- Approved, on recommendation from the Mission Ministry Team, that Session send a letter to the Bolivian government requesting immediate implementation of the environmental audit of the Kori Kollo mine in the state of Oruro and the area surrounding the mine.
- Reviewed a recommendation from the Mission Ministry Team and the Green Team that Session adopt the Presbyterian USA Denominational Policy set forth in the document entitled “The Power to Change: U.S. Energy Policy and Global Warming,” adopted in 2008 by the General Assembly. Most elders had carefully read the document prior to coming to the meeting. There was extensive discussion of the document Session was being asked to approve. Session did not adopt the recommendation, but committed to continue dialogue with the Green Team discerning our call as faithful stewards of God’s earth.

A copy of the August 18 Session minutes and the June and July financial statements are on file in the Session notebook in the Library. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact the clerk or one of the Ruling Elders. The next Session meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 15, at 6 p.m. in the Library.

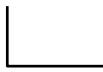
## Prayer Chain
